## **Immanuel Baptist Church, Kyle Texas**

"The ocean liner, now on the last day of her voyage, plowed tranquilly through the rolling waters of the Atlantic. In a few hours the immigrants on board would step out into a new land of new aspirations and new expectations.

A few days later wagons drawn by sturdy mules were wending their way across the continent, not all to the same place but all for the same purpose: to establish a new home in the "land of liberty." This dream was realized on March 14, 1883 when two families arrived in Kyle, Texas. The long journey from Hessen, Germany, was finished." (Excerpt from 1961 church history)

On February 15, 1886, a group of these German settlers met to organize the Immanuel Baptist Church under the name of the First German Baptist Church. There were sixteen charter members with names like Heidenreich, Wiegand, Mueller, and Siebenhausen. During the coming years, additional families were added: the Marstellars, the Lengefelds, the Ahlhardts, and the Schmeltekopfs. The first service of baptism was conducted on March 5, 1886, as two Wiegand sisters were added to the church.

In 1891, Brother Marstellar made available two acres of land for the building site and the pastor's home. Two years later a church was built, and on March 25, the buildings were dedicated debt-free to the Lord. In September of that year, the first pastor, Rev. J.A. Benson, was installed. In 1931 Rev. C. H. Edinger began his service, during which Sunday School wings were added while repairing fire damage to the roof. In September 1940, the church building caught fire and was totally destroyed. The present structure of native stone was dedicated on

May 5, 1941. A pipe organ was donated and installed by Otto J. Hofmann. At the same time, the name was changed to Immanuel Baptist Church.

Other significant events in the life of the church were:

- Nov. 1966—became "parent" of the first church extension work of the Southern Conference, the Anderson Road Baptist Church in Houston
- July 1976—steeple dedicated in honor of the Emil Schmeltekopf family
- 1995—parsonage of native stone was completed and dedicated
- April 3, 2005—dedication of the Christian Life Center
- Feb. 28, 2010—Hispanic Ministry launched
- June 26, 2011—125<sup>th</sup> Anniversary celebrated
