to acknowledge His work of grace in and through our spiritual forebears in the churches. In this consciousness we carefully tend the candle flame of the past, eagerly safeguard the secrets of the present and faithfully keep the keys of the future, certain that the memory of our

churches shall be as good and beautiful as the prizeless documents and objects of our North American Baptist Heritage Commission.
