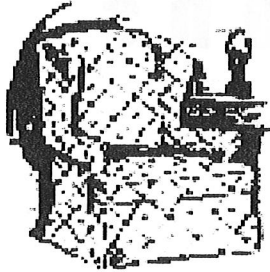

## WISH LIST FOR THE HERITAGE COMMISSION



1. Single copies of The Baptist Herald (See list at Display Booth)
2. Single copies of Der Sendbote
3. Der Perlen, an early Women's paper
4. Der Rundfunk, an early Women's paper
5. The Broadcast, an early Women's paper
6. A short history of every women's group in NAB churches, even those churches that are closed
7. Anniversary books, cups, mugs and plates of your church
8. Your WMF or church Cook Books
9. A copy of your family's life story
10. Obituaries of people in the NAB family
11. News items about your church or its members

### We also need people who are willing:

- to translate books and papers from German to English.
- to serve as Church Historians.
- to help write the story of our WMF (Women's Missionary Fellowship).  
(It is a story that should be told! Visit the WMF display and be inspired.)
- to write the story of their church's women's work. (At the display booth of the Heritage Commission, get ideas by asking to see what the Chancellor, SD women have done.)
